A New Look For A New Day: Cross Winds Branding Update

On September 20, 1992, Cross Winds was officially chartered as a local United Methodist congregation. The original guiding image of Cross Winds UMC was the compass, which has served faithfully as a logo to help us find our way forward as a church.

Now as we celebrate 30 years of ministry, we are proud to unveil the next chapter for Cross Winds United Methodist Church with our updated design. This new branding includes a Spirit filled logo which invites all into the heart of God as our center and sends us out into the world, inspired by the Spirit to serve. In the Bible, the Holy Spirit is often portrayed as a rushing wind, moving, shaping, and transforming the world. As we begin this new season of ministry, we celebrate the Spirit of God rushing like a mighty wind to inspire, empower, and equip us to love like Jesus as Cross Winds United Methodist Church.

Branding Design Process

Last year, the Communications Team received approval from the Board to begin work with Studio Lola on the Cross Winds brand refresh. The designer had been recommended through other local United Methodist Churches and was chosen after an intentional review process. A work group consisting of both board members and communication team members then collaborated with the designer to prepare a new branding for Cross Winds that embodies the spirit of the church and the future before us. Moving forward, the branding will be integrated into the marketing work of the church.

October 2 - Confronting Pharaoh

Confronting Pharaoh was no easy task for Moses or the people of Israel. At this point in the Exodus story, conflict is high, the drama is epic, and plagues abound making this a bold yet theologically troublesome series of events. Here we encounter the real costs of letting people go.

October 16 - What Have We Done?

Exodus 14:5-7, 10-14, 21-29

Amidst the chaotic terror that surrounds the Israelites while escaping from Egypt, they cry out "What have you done?" Moses responds, "Don't be afraid...keep still" as the sea parts and safety is found. Today we journey through the story of the Red Sea, looking to God for wisdom, deliverance, and strength to speak those same words of reassurance in our own storms.

October 9 - God of the Oppressed

Exodus 12:1-14

The story of the Passover, is the story of God's redemption. The Israelites had been in Egyptian captivity for hundreds of years. The Passover celebrates their miraculous deliverance from Egyptian slavery. The story of the Passover, also teaches that God is the God of the oppressed, the weak, the poor, as well as the vulnerable.

October 23 - Have Your Fill



Inclusive Congregation Conversation Updates from the Board

In September, the people of Cross Winds had the opportunity to participate in several workshops and a congregational forum to discuss the nature of inclusivity with respect to the United Methodist Church, Minnesota Annual Conference, and Cross Winds UMC in particular. Pastor Stina led several workshops in preparation for the Congregational Forum on September 25th which was facilitated by the Cross Winds Board.

During our September 25 forum, people participated in holy conferencing to discuss the board's recommendation that the following statement be added to our church's vision statement.

Cross Winds Statement:

We are committed to inclusiveness in all aspects of the life of the Church. Following Jesus' example, we will work to intentionally welcome and include all persons. We will live this example by embracing the richness of diversity such as age, race, ethnicity, ability, sexual orientation, economic status and gender identity found within the fullness of the community.

After prayerfully discussing the proposed statement, the people who gathered voted 94% in affirmation of the statement.

The board is grateful for the healthy and sacred conversations and participation of people who engaged in the workshops as well as at the forum. We are committed to leadership and deepening our life as a welcoming and inclusive congregation and are excited to see our story continue to unfold.




Prayer Shawl Ministry


We are also diligently working away at the outdoor deck, thanks to the leadership of Jeff Ducklow.


