#### Pastor's Note by Stina Koppes



"When Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, the child leaped in her womb, and Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit. With a loud voice she blurted out, 'God has blessed you above all women, and he has blessed the child you carry. Why do I have this honor, that the mother of my Lord should come to me? As soon as I heard your greeting, the baby in my womb jumped for joy. Happy is she who believed that the Lord would fulfill the promises he made to her."

Luke 1:41-45

This fall I've had the joy of having friends and colleagues surprise me with visits during worship. After services, when I've had time to greet them, I tend to rush up and blurt out, "It's so good to see you! What are you doing here?!" My heart is filled with joy at seeing them.

Surprise visits can make our hearts leap and our voices blurt out. When old friends stop by unexpectedly to church, it makes me wonder like Elizabeth, "Why do I have this honor that you should come to me?"

The Christmas season tends to bring unexpected visits. Whether at church or out and about in our daily lives, this is a season when we have both planned and unexpected visits. The Biblical stories at Christmas are filled with this theme - Mary visiting Elizabeth, the shepherds, and the wisemen. Story after story of unexpected visits that erupt in joy.

Sometimes the visits are with familiar friends and family, like Mary & Elizabeth. Yet more often, the visits come from unprompted strangers like those shepherds and wisemen coming to visit Mary, Joseph, and Jesus. Christmas has a way of drawing our circles wider, as we welcome even more people into our lives. I think about all of the people that will be coming to Cross Winds events this month, and my heart leaps for joy; not because of the numbers of people, but for the opportunity for this community to extend hospitality, grace, and love. My hope is that each person who comes through our doors this month will be welcomed with a blessing and filled with joy.

Wherever life takes you this Christmas, I encourage you to be open to these holy moments, when God sends people your way unannounced. Your house may be a mess. Your calendar may be overstuffed. Let them in. Welcome them. Let yourself blurt out! In these encounters, this is where the Holy Spirit has room to leap within you as you experience a deeper joy that comes at Christmas.

### **December 18 - Cross Winds Presents: A Christmas Special**





# Christ mas program SIMPSON HOUSING SERVICES

#### **Christmas Gift Program - Simpson Housing Services**

Give the gift of hope this Christmas through the Cross Winds Christmas Gift Program in support of Simpson Housing Services. Simpson Housing Services' mission is, "To house, support, and advocate for people experiencing homelessness." Since their beginnings in 1982 in the basement of Simpson United Methodist Church, Simpson has become a leading nonprofit providing assistance to people experiencing homelessness. In response to unmet community needs, their services have grown to include five key programs: emergency shelter, supportive housing programs for youth, single adults, and families - along with developmental and educational services for children of families in their Family Housing Program. Last year, they provided supportive services to 568 individuals and 275 families with more than 593 children.

This December, Cross Winds will be collecting money and New Women/Men's Winter Supplies to support Simpson.

Last year, Alison Young – the Blissful Hiker – walked the 800-mile Arizona Trail. As desert gave way to forest, canyon to "sky island," surprises were revealed to her as if opening an Advent Calendar. Her steps became grounded with the spirit and ones of meditative wonder.

we climbed Mt Everest and saw the Northern Lights, swam in the Great Barrier Reef and the Grand Canyon sand brought us delight!














#### **2023 High School Mission Trip**

Our teens will serve with local organizations on both sides of the state line that strive to provide basic needs for community members. We will serve residents of all ages through maintaining community gardens, assisting at local community kitchens and food pantries, and working alongside of organizations that care for the basic needs of their neighbors. In the evenings, we will



engage with a long term friend of YouthWorks who will share more about the neighborhoods we serve. We will also experience the sites and history of the city through a scavenger hunt and have time to enjoy local attractions and some great BBQ! Youthworks has partnered with this community since 2008.

#### Bishop Lanette Plambeck Assigned to Dakotas-Minnesota Area

Bishop Lanette Plambeck has been assigned as the resident bishop for the Dakotas-Minnesota Area effective Jan. 1, 2023. She was elected to the episcopacy at the 2022 North Central Jurisdictional Conference. Before her election, she served as the assistant to the bishop and director of clergy and leadership Excellence in the Iowa Annual Conference.

Bishop Plambeck, in her pastoral service, has served as a local church pastor in four different pastoral settings

including urban, county seat, town, and country. She has experience as a college chaplain and a licensed counselor in family systems and chemical and substance abuse. She is a veteran of the U.S. Army and was deployed to Desert Storm/Desert Shield.

She says the measure of her leadership is three questions she asks herself at the end of each day: Did I glorify God? Did I point people to Christ? Did I love? She describes herself as "unapologetically Wesleyan and so in love with Jesus and his ministry marked by compassion, grace and justice." A gift she brings as a leader is "to inspire others to live lives of significance as we work for 'kingdom on earth as it is in heaven' through active discipleship as we respond to the suffering in the world. I am committed to developing leaders (clergy and laity) to grow into the very best versions of themselves so that they can be at their very best for God."

Bishop Plambeck has one adult daughter who lives in the Washington, D.C. area.
