Pastor's Note by Stina Koppes



God heard their cry of grief, and God remembered his covenant with Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob. God looked at the Israelites, and God understood. (Exodus 2:24-25)

The book of Exodus is dramatic, filled with miraculous encounters that capture the imagination. These acts were more than mere divine parlor tricks. The wellbeing of a nation was at risk as the Israelites found themselves trapped in Egyptian slavery. In the Book of Exodus, we learn that God leads the Israelites out of slavery and prepares them to become a new nation. The stories have become central texts for both Jewish and Christian traditions alike.

In the Book of Exodus, before the burning bush, the plagues, the Red Sea parting, pillars of fire & smoke, manna from heaven, or water flowing from rocks, we are told that before any action occurred....

God heard God remembered commitments God looked God understood

This is where Exodus begins. Awareness and compassion.

For God, this was more than a sympathetic moment of giving God's best "thoughts and prayers" amidst a tough time. God remembered that a divine commitment (aka covenant) had been made to care for these people. God understood that something must be done. God called Moses. God acted through signs and wonders. God spoke instructions. God led the people directly.

It was not a pretty or easy journey.

In the Book of Exodus, we also see the costs of hearing, remembering, looking, and understanding. Frequently God gets frustrated. Regularly the people grumble. Moses has temper tantrums.

Yet through each leg of the journey, new seeing, new understanding, and a deepening of commitment emerges.

The Book of Exodus shows us all the pattern of genuine liberation. It is messy, confusing, and reveals ugliness within ourselves as well as the fabric of humanity. Yet through it all, we are shown that God will hear, remember, look, and understand. God will lead. God will redeem. God will impart wisdom.

This fall, I invite you to join me in our exploration of The Exodus together, whether through worship or small group study. This central book of the Bible has much to reveal to all of us. Yet, I warn you, in the encounter, if you are open to the stirrings of God, you too will be called to hear, remember, look, and understand. It will change you.

Capital Campaign Project Updates

Our first capital campaign project is close to completion! The new motorized window shades are scheduled for install in the sanctuary. A big thanks to Dick Post, Brad Johnson, Lori Lahtinen, Michelle Schober, and the entire Project Management Team (PMT) for working diligently on this project.

This month we also hope to see work beginning on our new deck. As this project is completed, you will see both the new deck as well as the movement of our exterior fellowship hall door in preparation for the kitchen redesign. Getting the deck finished now will allow for a staging area and access point for kitchen construction. There will be a few weeks when the fellowship hall will be inaccessible, while the doors are moved. However, the staff will be ready to adjust programming needs accordingly and the overall gain will be worth it. A big thank you to Jeff Ducklow for coordinating this project along with our PMT and trustees who are providing assistance.

Planning work continues on the kitchen redesign. General contractors are being selected, an architect and kitchen designers have created official designs for review, and material selections are being considered. The team is working on submitting plans to the City of Maple Grove this fall and we hope to have more information about the project timeline soon. A big thanks to Paul Crosland, Mike Ronning, Dave Looney, Linda Dickey, Jeanine Ronning, Joanie Lewis, the PMT and trustees for their ongoing work on this project.

Come at 9am on September 11 for an open house to see the rooms, meet the leaders and hear about all the great things coming this year!


